Show and tell included a diabolical prediction effect performed by Ed the Wizard. It made great use of the 'one ahead' principle. (Isn't most magic accomplished simply with the one ahead principle?) Bob Cain dove into his box of treasures and pondered over a patriotic rope effect. A short card workshop concluded the first half of the meeting as pizza arrived and attention quickly turned towards the food.



The second half of our May meeting featured a lecture by Master Craftsman Tony Karpinski. Anyone who's purchased and performed with Tony's beautiful apparatus understands the unique quality and reliability involved in his work.

Magic Barn members were treated to a personal workshop hosted by the master himself. The discussion began with a background of Tony's past, growing up in New Jersey, serving in the Air Force and how his interests in magic and woodworking began.



On display were numerous pieces of handmade wooden apparatus to be performed and discussed in depth by Tony. Our young compeer Nate the Great was invited up to assist in handing out several souvenirs for attendees to keep. Members had the choice of a mini magic wand & case, a coin vanishing stand or a dice tube. These gifts were just the tip of the iceberg as Tony's lecture proved to be filled with numerous treasures, tips and insight only one can glean from personal experience. Nate was compensated with a new Die Box for his helpful assistance.

Fascinating details were shared involving the intricacies of working with magic dealers. Tony sells his apparatus directly to retail distributors such as Murphy's Magic and previously to Hank Lee - stories of meeting product quotas, receiving payments and time spent building magic by hand kept members entranced for the full hour lecture.

Tony demonstrated such classics as The Coins of Copentro, various Die Boxes and discussed what makes for a quality wood design on a shelf or on stage while in a spot light. (There's a big difference!) We received sneak peeks of new ideas such as Needle Through Glass and learned about personal projects requested by other magicians.






Inside General Grants Workshop

You may recognize Gen Grant for his superb stage work with Doves. Over the decades magicians and Dove Workers have sough out Gen's products. His one-hand dove release and pockets are still considered tops in the field. These products and many more were hand crafted in his workshop.





The Butterfly Production is a superb effect created and performed by Karl Germain, where a handful of silks previously produced turns into a huge silk Butterfly. (Germain The Wizard. Stuart&Karr. P63, 168) The mechanical gimmick went through various phases, the final being a lazy tongs. Gen shares with The Gimmick his fabrication of this device.

Gen began by asking Magic Barn founder George Lentros to build this lazy tongs gimmick. Although Lentros Engineering is equipped to design and build products for the US government, the wait time was too long and so Gen found it was better if he simply tried to build it himself.



In his garage workshop using a lathe and other machines Gen created a very special piece of apparatus and it worked brilliantly! Under cover of a large silk with butterfly pattern, the lazy tongs were quickly extended, expanding from a foot to over approximately six feet in length, the silk butterfly made its stunning appearance.



Several gimmicks were sold at a high price but Gen kept the very first to proudly display. Although this method differs form Karl Germain's original *Butterfly* it remains a striking and beautiful effect. No doubt Gen's ingenuity has added several improvements to existing designs.

Today, magic is too often purchased, it is a rare thing to find magic hand crafted to ones specific needs, and thus more is understood in its operation by doing so.

It was a pleasure to spend time discussing magic with a true master of the art. Thank you Gen Grant for sharing your brilliance!
