



Further discussion revolved around performing for people who may not enjoy magic. Certain religious communities or misinformed individuals may view magic in a negative way, or as a 'forbidden' practice. Gospel Magic is a niche segment where magic is used as a teaching tool. Other props and effects he asked members for clarification. Dennis Pimenta not only identified but also performed the Siberian Chain Escape. Bob's 'What Is It Box' always generates great conversation.




Scott Martell closed out the meeting with a lecture on the Diminishing Cards effect. He demonstrated and taught various methods, mostly clever mechanical versions as well as impromptu presentations. Scott asked the group for presentational ideas as to why a deck of cards would become smaller? Would your pasteboards shrink after traveling through a washer and dryer, or perhaps a witchdoctor shruk the kings head? In addition to the shrinking cards, Scott offered reverse effects where the cards instead grew in size!
